Earlier this year, The Valley Hospital announced plans to build a state-of-the-art, 372-bed hospital in Paramus - across the street



from the Blumenthal Cancer New The Nalley Hospital enable Valley to meet the longterm needs of the northern New Jersey community by providing

enhanced services, new medical technology, single patient rooms and more.

Valley's Certificate of Need application, filed in February, is pending approval by the New Jersey Department of Health. The next step will be a thorough review of Valley's site plan by the Borough of Paramus. Once approved, Valley plans to break ground for the hospital in 2019, with an estimated opening in 2023.
